

### Orthodontic reatment











#### 1. What is Orthodontic treatment?

It is the treatment involving use of appliances to correct the arrangement of teeth and improve the appearance and/or chewing efficiency.

### 2. What are the types of orthodontic appliances?

- a. Removable appliances- These can be removed easily by the patient for cleaning.
- b. Fixed braces- These are fixed to the teeth during treatment and cannot be removed from the mouth for cleaning.

## 3. Do you need to change your diet during Orthodontic treatment?

- Avoid hard and sticky food like nuts, toffees, chewing gums, hard biscuits etc.
- Fresh fruits and vegetables like apples, carrots etc. must be cut into small pieces and chewed using the back teeth.

# 4. Do you need to change your oral hygiene habits while undergoing orthodontic treatment?

- Food gets easily trapped around the braces or metal wires, leading to plaque formation.
- Failure to remove food debris and plaque between the teeth and appliance can cause damage to the teeth (loss of tooth minerals, cavities) and gum problems (swollen, painful, bleeding gums).

## Importance of oral hygiene during orthodontic treatment:

- Maintaining good oral hygiene is very essential while undergoing
- It will prevent permanent marks, cavities on teeth and gum diseases during and after orthodontic treatment.



### Oral Care with Removable Orthodontic Appliances:

Learn to insert and remove the appliance or retainer from the mouth.



- The teeth and appliance should be cleaned after every meal and before going to sleep at night.
- Food particles and plaque accumulate on your appliance just as they do on your teeth.
- Use soft bristle toothbrush and fluoride tooth paste to clean the teeth.
- Clean the appliance carefully using toothbrush and paste. Hold it by the plastic part, without moving, bending or distorting its metallic components.



### Oral Care with Fixed Orthodontic Appliances:

Small metal/ceramic attachments (brackets) are fixed on the teeth with special adhesive and cannot be removed. Wires or elastic bands are attached to these brackets.



- The teeth with braces should be cleaned after every meal and before going to sleep at night.
- Spend sufficient time to clean around each tooth, concentrating on removing the food debris and plaque between the teeth, at gum line, around the bracket, wire or elastics.
- Always use fluoride toothpaste with soft bristled manual or powered toothbrush.

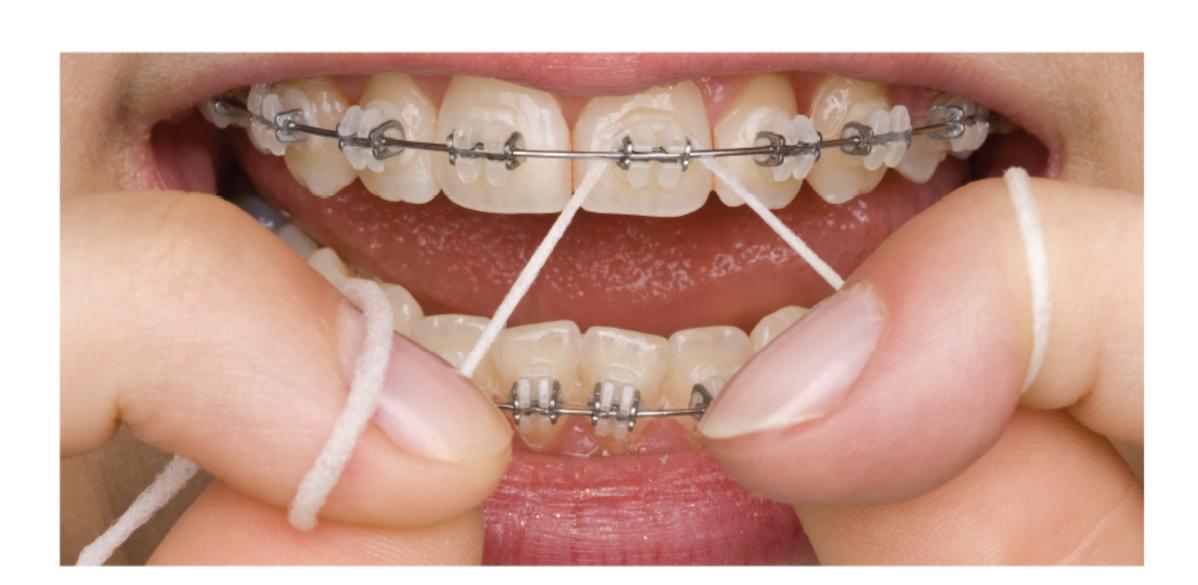
